

OUR HISTORY

The mission of the YWCA Kalamazoo is to eliminate racism and empower women and gender non-conforming individuals.

- Member association of YWCA USA, one of the oldest and largest women's organizations in the nation, serving over 2 million women, girls, and their families.
- YWCA Kalamazoo was founded in 1885 and services as the oldest association in Michigan.
- Originally established to provide residence services for young women, YWCA
 Kalamazoo now serves as a primary resource for economic, gender, and racial justice for all women and girls in Kalamazoo.

- Support Services for Victims/Survivors of Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault and Human Trafficking
- Shelter and Support

- Counseling and Support, Legal Representation and Consultation regarding Family and Housing Laws, Immigration Matters, crime Victims' Rights.
- Advocate for social justice by advancing racial and gender equity, public policy changes, and providing education to promote equal protection/safety for families and equal opportunities for people of color, women and girls, and the most vulnerable in our community.
- Legal team including an attorney, case managers and paralegal on staff, provides advocacy and legal support to survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence and human trafficking.

INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

SEXUAL ASSAULT SUPPORTIVE, VICTIM SERVICES

- YWCA Kalamazoo Emergency Response non-paid Internship will give you direct experience working with victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and human trafficking.
- You will gain competencies in crisis intervention, empathy, advocacy and systems change.
- Current student in related program required.

CLASSROOM INTERN, EARLY EDUCATION

 Assist with educational programs that support vulnerable children with trauma-informed racial and gender-justice curriculum.

THERAPIST, VICTIM SERVICES

- Sexual Assault, Intimate Partner Violence, Human Trafficking survivor population
- Bachelor's degree in psychology, social work, or closely related field. Must be enrolled in a Master's program in psychology, social work, or closely related field.
- Specific training in trauma, intimate partner violence, sexual assault, and/or human trafficking is highly desired but not necessary.
- A demonstrated working knowledge preferably with trauma specialization or with survivor population preferred.

FOOD SERVICES INTERNSHIP

• The Kitchen Team Cuisine Assistant helps with food service, preparation, and delivery to classrooms.

AGE REQUIREMENTS

Most YWCA programs require volunteers to be 18 years of age.

18 and under require parental/guardian approval and approval of program director.

The Dreamery volunteers must be 18 years of age.

DOCUMENT REQUIREMENTS

Required background checks

Classroom support positions require a current TB test. Fingerprinting is required for 4+ hours per week and more than 2 consecutive weeks.



LET'S GET STARTED!

- Parking for Main site, 353 E. Michigan Avenue is located on the SW corner of Water and Pitcher Street.
