- Advocacy and System Change: Advocate for Social Justice by advancing Racial and Gender Equity, advocating for Public Policy changes, providing education that promotes equal protection and safety for families and equal opportunities for people of color, women and girls, and the most vulnerable in our community.

INFORMATION AND REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION

Age Requirements

Most YWCA programs require *volunteers* to be 18 years of age 18 and under require parental/guardian approval and approval of program director.

Children's Center Volunteers must be 18 years of age. *Interns* must be in *current* BS/MA related program
